DSBN Parent Engagement Opportunity

The focus of DSBN Parent Engagement work in March will be on helping families navigate community funding and support for children and youth with ASD and Developmental Diagnoses. Bethesda is partnering with the Social Work and Special Education Departments for a <u>Virtual Workshop</u> March 22nd at 12 Noon — available to all DSBN families to <u>register</u>. The workshop will focus on common questions brought to the DSBN by families looking to navigate the ASD and Developmental system in Niagara. It will answer questions such as:

- I think my child/teen may have ASD/Developmental needs, how do we get an assessment in the community?
- We have a new ASD or Dev Dx, how do I begin to access funding and support in the community?
- I have a child/teen living with ASD/Dev Dx and would like more info about specific programming available to support us in the community?

Immunization Record Review/Suspension


In the fall Niagara Region Public Health (NRPH) sent immunization reminder notices to the homes of <u>students who did not have up-to-date immunization</u>

Dear Glendale Families,

I wanted to reach out to you to share information regarding recent boundary changes in Welland that will result in Glendale receiving more students over the next few years. As you may be aware, the northern part of Welland and the southern part of Thorold have been the focus of new housing construction and subdivision approvals over the last 7 years. As a result, there have been significant enrolment increases in schools as new families move into the area.

The DSBN have requested to build a new elementary school and the request is currently being reviewed by the Ministry of Education. To help with the enrolment pressures, a school boundary change involving Quaker Road PS and Glendale PS was developed, proposed, and approved during the February 6th Program and Planning Committee meeting and approved at the Board Meeting on February 27th. The boundary change establishes a new school boundary for the proposed new school. The plan also includes a holding area boundary that directs any new students who move into the new school boundary to a holding school. Glendale PS has been identified as the holding school that will temporarily accommodate new students until the new school has been built. As a result, we will see a growth in enrolment at Glendale over the next few years and, as will all the other schools in our area, we will be adding portables to accommodate our growing population. The Glendale property size is more than big enough to accommodate the portables required until the new school is open.

I am confident that this will be a positive change as we welcome more students, more staff, and more opportunities for our students in the coming years.
